They started out the day with an Introduction to Positive Leadership presented by Nicole Deary '17, our Fellows Program Director. Afterwards, Turkey Jay '17 helped facilitate a Thanksgiving Plate Challenge for the Fellows.

Then, Tom Kaden '23 and Angie Dickinson '24 of Someone To Tell It To, presented on "Working Genius". Fellows used the 6 types of Working Genius as a model to discover how they are wired to show up in the work process and learn to leverage their geniuses appropriately for increased productivity and connection within a team.

After lunch, they took a plant tour of our host sponsor, Carlisle Construction Materials. Our last presentation of the day was given by Ivy Buchan, PhD, of Invoke Nonprofit Consulting, on Nonprofits 101. This session provides a fundamental overview of the processes of a governing board, including the basics of decision-making. They finished out the day with some team building, and overall, it was a great first class day. We can't wait to see what the Fellows learn next in their November Session!

In the last three years, the YWCA of Carlisle & Cumberland County has documented about 140 human trafficking cases and are working to build solutions and opportunities for individuals to move out of Human Trafficking and rebuild their lives. The Cumberland County District Attorney's office created the Human Trafficking Task Force in 2022. Since then, the task force has arrested more than 100 people through human trafficking prosecutions and shut down seven illegal Asian massage parlor operations.

CENTRAL PENNSYLVANIA CONSERVANCY - BOARD TREASURER POSITION

A local land conservation organization, [Central Pennsylvania Conservancy](#) (CPC), seeks to fill a vacancy for the Treasurer position on its Board of Directors. Since 1982, CPC's mission has been to acquire, preserve, and protect local land and natural resources in South-Central Pennsylvania. Serving a core geographic area of Cumberland, Perry, and Franklin counties, CPC aims to create a local network of permanently protected lands, through funding partnerships, fostering a community committed to conservation, and acquiring key lands and conservation easements. The Board meets six times per year, typically on the third Tuesday every other month. The duties of the treasurer are to:

- Insure that CPC's fiduciary requirements are met, including an annual audit and annual report;
- Support and manage the annual budget process, develop and present annual budget to the Board;
- Present financial statements at Board meetings and make recommendations for budget change/deviations;
- Support the management of CPC's assets/endowments.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR CASA PROGRAM

Volunteers are the backbone of our program and the success for our children. The mission of the Cumberland County Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) Program is to assist the Court in determining what serves in the best interest of abused and/or neglected children whose cases are in the Dependency Court system. Through independent information-gathering and active case engagement, trained CASA volunteers develop and present their recommendations to the Court to aid in establishing a safe, permanent and nurturing home for the child or sibling group to whom they have been appointed. The four key roles of a CASA volunteer are: gather relevant information, facilitate, advocate for the child's best interests, and monitor the case- all with the goal of helping to support that child or sibling group to reach PERMANENCY.
