Community Engagement Projects

Leadership Cumberland partners with select nonprofit organizations within Cumberland County, providing our Fellows with opportunities to participate in a variety of Community Engagement Projects.

These small group projects provide civic engagement opportunities for the fellows to learn about and address critical community needs while developing deeper relationships with one another through teamwork while gaining experience leading in a team setting.

This year, five area nonprofits were chosen and over 150 volunteer hours given.

Autism in the Classrooms

The Fellows aided Autism in the Classrooms in analyzing resources and assisted with strategic planning in order to set goals and make connections for the organization. They identified and created contact with the



Autism Society of Greater Harrisburg Funding, which will provide 610 books titled "My Life with Gary, Coping with Autism Spectrum Disorder" to each elementary school classroom in Cumberland County and up to eight books in each Cumberland County Library.

The Salvation Army



This year, the Fellows worked with The Salvation Army in Carlisle on expanding one master informational brochure into six new brochures in an attempt to better highlight

the imperative information with a variety of stakeholders. The new brochures were split into the following categories: Housing, Social Services, Pathway of Hope, Volunteers, Senior Center, Spiritual Services, and a revamp of the current 'Tell All' brochure.

Safe Harbour

Fellows updated the backend of its website. A large part of this update helps Safe Harbour track new and existing volunteers for various needs. Through this process, Fellows learned to be more empathetic and thoughtful in communication as a group.

Craighead House



Our Fellows worked with the Craighead House

to expand the awareness of the organization as well as its mission. They brought its social media resources up-to-date and redesigned its website. Throughout the process, the Fellows helped the Craighead House to increase community engagement and also improved both its online and social media presence.

Saint Patrick School

The Fellows provided assistance to Saint Patrick
School in Carlisle with a community engagement project. They assisted by reaching out to 21 different non-



profit organization within the surrounding Carlisle area to look for potential community service opportunities for the students. The Fellows also created the "Rock On" initiative in which students paint kindness rocks and spread them throughout the community.
