
MEET OUR JLC CLASS HERE!

CARLISLE KIWANIS - REBUILDING FORT LETORT IN CARLISLE


is a great way to shop and avoid the crowds!

The Carlisle Kiwanis Club "celebrated" it's one-hundred-year anniversary in 2020, but due to the COVID-19 pandemic they were unable to complete a project to commemorate this important milestone. They feel there is no better way to celebrate our 100th anniversary than to give back to our community in a meaningful and impactful way – rebuilding the playground at LeTort Park in Carlisle. The original and existing playground structure was built in 1993 as a community build project and was lovingly named Fort LeTort. After 29 years of use, the playground has begun to show its age. Working closely with the Parks & Rec Department it has been decided that several state-of-the-art improvements need to be made to Fort Letort to make it safer and more accessible for the children of the community. It will be necessary to raise \$750,000 to replace the playground at LeTort Park.
