


LC PROGRAM OUTCOMES



Job Readiness Program

Fellows helped create a plan to launch the Teen Job Readiness Program in Eastern Cumberland County for school districts and employers for New Hope Ministries, a Christian Social Service Agency, servicing York, Adams, and Cumberland Counties.

In the Fall of 2021, we celebrated the accomplishments of the Hampden Township Veterans Recognition Committee and their outstanding community leadership in the development of Veterans Park and Captain Leon Lock Veterans Memorial.



The Hampden Township Veterans Park is for members of the community to gather for celebrations and observances in honor of veterans. The park's trails feature twelve granite etched monuments that commemorate conflicts the U.S. military has fought in throughout our country's history. The memorial will feature an amphitheater centered on the existing United States Flag area where there are flags representing the six individual military services – Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, Coast Guard, and the Merchant Marines. Each year the park honors veterans with Memorial Day and Veteran's Day celebrations and hosts over 10,000 visitors.

SPRING 2022

In the Spring we honored the Carlisle Family YMCA leadership team for their passion, dedication, and impact on the greater Carlisle community. More than a decade ago, the Board of Directors realized that the YMCA's aging facility was no longer serving the needs of the community. After a Strategic Planning Committee determined in 2015 that the best choice for the Carlisle Family YMCA was to remain at its current location, an \$8.5M capital campaign launched in 2016, tapping Hubert X. Gilroy of Martson Law Offices to serve as the campaign chair. Gilroy, together with vice-chair Ray 'Buz' Wolfe, Jr of Wolfe & Company

Realtors, assembled a team of volunteers for the campaign leadership cabinet whose three-year fundraising effort ultimately raised over 9 Million Dollars from over 350 individuals, corporations, and private foundations.

Continuing our partnership with the Partnership for Better Health (PFBH). Both LC and PFBH, worked together to host two online nonprofit trainings for nonprofit leadership, staff, and our alumni serving on boards.

Presented by a panel of speakers this webinar focused on four major topics. "Creating Inclusive & Diverse Boards" by C. Marie Taylor, Equity Through Action | May 3, 2022

This fully interactive course provided participants with key definitions and concepts to explore while working toward building Inclusive & Diverse Boards. Participants uncovered practical action steps to increase cultural diversity within their recruitment plans. Additionally, we explored inclusive leadership behaviors and built strategies to create a road map for action.


