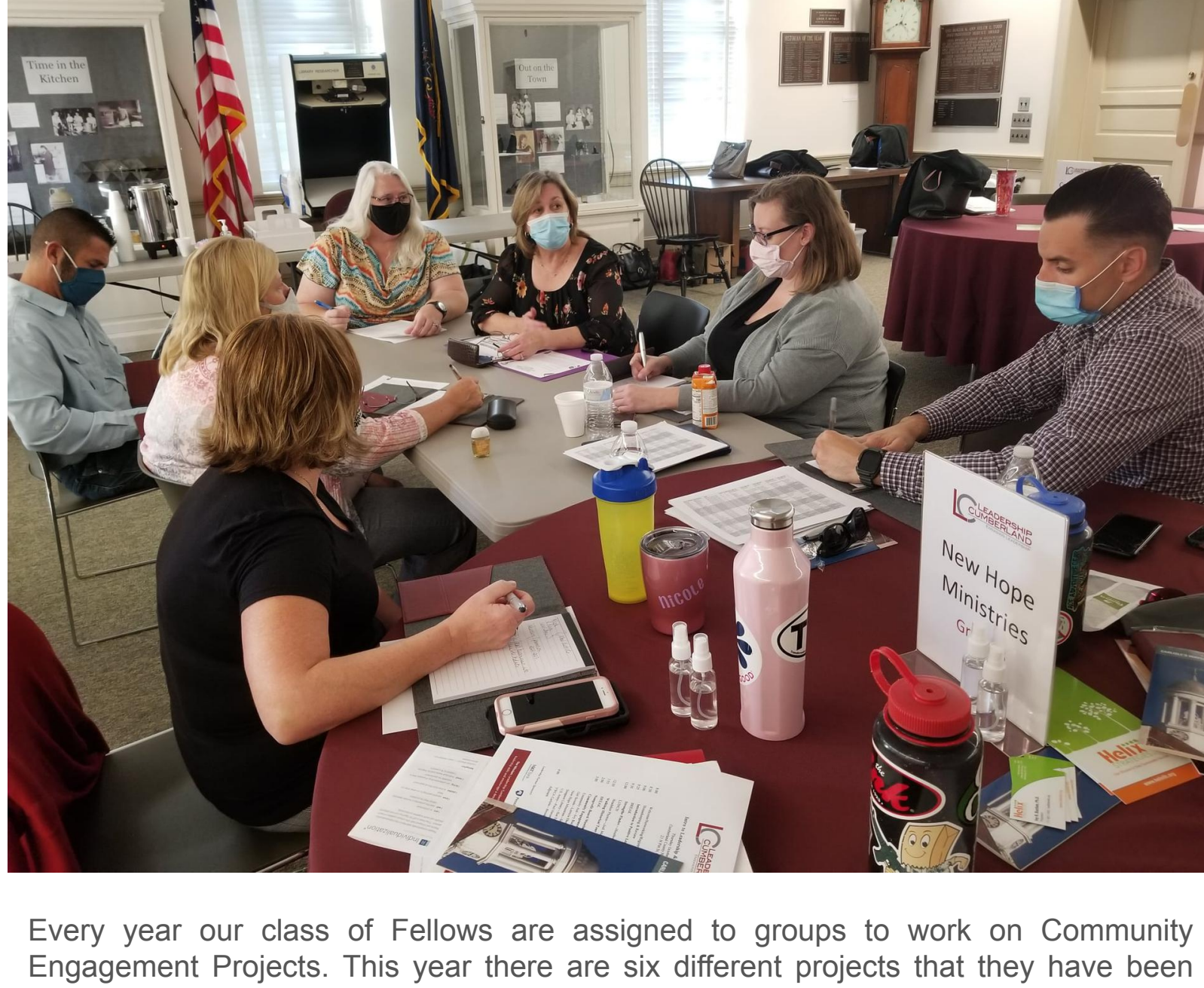


## FELLOWS GIVE UPDATE ON COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROJECTS



Every year our class of Fellows are assigned to groups to work on Community Engagement Projects. This year there are six different projects that they have been working on since the beginning of the year from Community Aid, Girl Scouts in the Heart of PA, New Hope Ministries, Joseph T. Simpson Library, U.S. Army Carlisle Barracks and YWCA Carlisle. Learn more about these projects below!

- **Community Aid** tasked our Fellows with helping set up their Neighbors Helping Neighbors (NHN) Program. The group has been working on creating an intake form that the organization can use to match a volunteer with an approved nonprofit.
- **Girl Scouts in the Heart of PA** asked their group to work on creating a spring event for girls in grades K-5 to participate in hands on STEM activities. The group has come really far in planning as they already have a date set for April, a mock-up of a flyer for promotion, and an ask out for event sponsorship.
- **New Hope Ministries** has asked their Fellows to help with the launch of their Teen Job Readiness Program in Eastern Cumberland County School Districts. The group has already created a QR Code to be used to promote the program, started creating a brochure and postcard for marketing, and their emphasis is creating the marketing collateral to help the organization.
- **Joseph T. Simpson Library** tasked their group to help with creating marketing resources to reach out to their diverse population in the library's service area. The group has been working on an engagement marketing plan to highlight a new topic each month and then ways to partner with local businesses to connect them with the community.
- **U.S. Army Carlisle Barracks** asked their group to complete an outreach study for potential partners and use of their "Farmhouse" facility that has been deemed a Carlisle Indian Industrial School National Historic Landmark. The Army has decided to use some of the building for department offices, however, the fellows have been working with the local Indian Tribes and community to participate in the creation of a reflection room within the building.
- **YWCA Carlisle** asked their Fellows for help in reworking the Race Against Racism event. The group has been working on providing an analysis of the event and they have secured Dickinson for the host location along with setting the event date on May 14th.

We're so excited to see where these projects end up and the amazing work that our Fellows complete.
